As Richmond's first church building, First Presbyterian Church was established in 1827. The current sanctuary was erected in 1920. The Casavant organ was installed in 1967, as "The Brown E. Telford Organ," in recognition of Miss Telford's years of devoted service to the church, both as a member and as organist from 1918 to 1962.

The restoration of the organ was done in connection with a major renovation project in the sanctuary, during which the organ was covered and sealed for protection against dust. All the pipework was removed and stored on the church premises.

After the renovation was completed in the church, the organ was thoroughly cleaned. The console was shipped back to the Casavant workshop to be refurbished. The reed stops were reconditioned to improve tuning stability. The façade pipes were cleaned and repolished. The windchest pallets and wind regulators were releathered. The mechanical action was readjusted and the pipework was tonally regulated and tuned.
